Community members who donate \$50 or more to Operation Kindness through their <u>summer fundraising campaign</u> will be able to submit a name suggestion for the organization's intake team to use for an incoming dog or cat.

"At Operation Kindness, we welcome each incoming animal with medical attention, nourishing food and a name to let them know that they are part of our family as we find them a loving home," said Ed Jamison, CEO of Operation Kindness. "We can't do our life saving work without the support of the community, and we're excited to see the names we're offered from the public through this special campaign."
