Originally transferred in with her two nursing puppies and eight other dogs from the City of Laredo Animal Care Services, Lilly is the last of the group to be adopted.

Lilly is a sweet, social butterfly who loves attention and is seeking human companionship. Her floppy ears would put a smile on anyone's face. She would make a great fit for a family that enjoys playtime and laughing at her goofy nature. Taking walks around the neighborhood and running around outside make her a perfect pet for outdoor lovers. Lilly's vibrant personality is really on show when she gets her paws on a toy, which is her second love right after humans.

Despite her goofiness, Lilly takes her command training seriously. Described as a "forever student" by a staff member at Operation Kindness, Lilly is knowledgeable in basic commands and enjoys learning. Lilly's instinct to please those around her makes her a great pet to teach fun and helpful commands.

Lilly is eligible for a seven-day trial adoption through our Foster First program. This program allows pets and potential adopters time to ensure it's a great match before finalizing the adoption. She is spayed, microchipped and up to date on her vaccinations and preventions.
