


After 130+ days, Nutmeg Remains on the Search for a Loving Companion

The North Texas animal welfare non-profit wants to help a gentle, two-year old Shepard dog find a loving home by offering free adoption



FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE (Carrollton, Texas) – Nutmeg is a 50 pound, love-filled dog who is still waiting for a place to call home after an over 130 days wait. In 2022, Nutmeg first came to Operation Kindness as a puppy after making the 120-mile-long journey from the Humane Society of Young County. When transferred, Nutmeg was diagnosed with Parvovirus, received lifesaving treatment in Operation Kindness' Reese-Jones Foundation Medical Wing and was adopted shortly thereafter. However, she was returned back into Operation Kindness' care in June 2024 and is looking for a companion of her own.

Nutmeg is a two-year-old Shepard that loves playing with other dogs, making her a perfect sibling for another dog. Her wagging tail and floppy tongue never fails to make an appearance when she is bouncing around outside while chasing her dog friends.

Not only is she social with other dogs, but Nutmeg is also a huge fan of humans and would never turn away from the chance to snuggle. She loves soaking in the attention of her favorite humans and receiving pets. Nutmeg's easygoing and sweet nature makes her a perfect pet for anyone searching for companionship.

At Operation Kindness, <u>adoption fees</u> are waived for dogs over 40 pounds, making Nutmeg completely free to adopt. Adoption fees include spay/neuter surgery, vaccinations, microchips, a free 30-day pet insurance and a complimentary trial of pet food.

Nutmeg is eligible for a seven-day trial adoption through Operation Kindness' Foster First program.

This program allows pets and potential adopters time to ensure it's a great match before finalizing

the adoption. Nutmeg is spayed, microchipped and up to date on her vaccinations and

preventions.
