

Enjoy double the love with Bones and Pearl, a bonded dog pair searching for a loving family together

Operation Kindness, a North Texas animal welfare non-profit, wants to help two three-year-old dogs find a loving home by waving their adoption fees



FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE (Carrollton, Texas) – On February 19, 2025, Pearl — a three-year-old, 35 pound female mix breed — made the hour-long journey from the City of Alvarado's Animal Control to <u>Operation Kindness</u> — 36 hours before Bones made the same journey. Pearl was restless during that time, but finally felt content once her familiar friend, Bones, walked through Operation Kindness' doors and was housed within her sight. Operation Kindness staff noticed this change in Pearl after her reunion with Bones and designated them as a bonded pair, now the North Texas non-profit is hoping to find them a home together.

"Pearl cried for about 36 hours consecutively after arrival," said Erin Fletcher, a behavior specialist at Operation Kindness. "As soon as she saw Bones, Pearl quieted down and has not shown that same level of anxiety since."

Bonded pairs are two animals who have special, deep relationships, which can occur at animal shelters.

Both dogs came to Operation Kindness as heartworm positive and received medical treatment in the North Texas shelter's <u>Rees-Jones Foundation Medical Wing</u>. Now the duo is healthy and is excited for their future together. Bones and Pearl enjoy spending time together, no matter how big

or small the task at hand is. They especially love chasing one another during playtime and going on

strolls around the neighborhood together.

To help the duo find a loving family together, Operation Kindness has waived both their adoption

fees. Adoption fees include spay/neuter surgery, vaccinations, microchips, a free 30-day pet

insurance and a complimentary trial of pet food.

Bones and Pearl are eligible for a seven-day trial adoption through Operation Kindness' Foster First

program. This program allows pets and potential adopters time to ensure it's a great match before

finalizing the adoption. Both dogs are spayed/neutered, microchipped and up to date on their

vaccinations and preventions.
