Operation Kindness encourages community members to remember pets without families during the holidays by visiting long-term residents at their <u>Carrolton shelter</u>. Not only can individuals donate toys and treats as stocking stuffers for shelter pets, visitors can explore the cat and dog rooms at the main shelter. Community members are welcome to watch dogs enjoy playtime in the shelter's play yards or even snuggle with a pet of their choice in a meet-and-greet room. Operation Kindness allows community members to foster a pet for the day with their <u>"Kindness on the Go"</u> program. The program is completely free and offers community members the opportunity to pick up a furry friend for a day of adventure, providing a much-needed break for dogs from the shelter environment.

Long-stay pets with stockings that are adopted into new families this holiday season will be gifted with their stocking during their adoption. Community members can visit Operation Kindness at 3201 Earhart Drive Carrollton, Texas 75006 from 11 a.m. to 7 p.m. daily. The shelter will close at 3 p.m. on Christmas Eve and be closed on Christmas and New Years Day, but community members are able to browse the

<u>adoptable pets</u> anytime on Operation Kindness' <u>website</u>. All adoptable pets come with up-to-date

vaccinations, a microchip and are spay/neutered.
